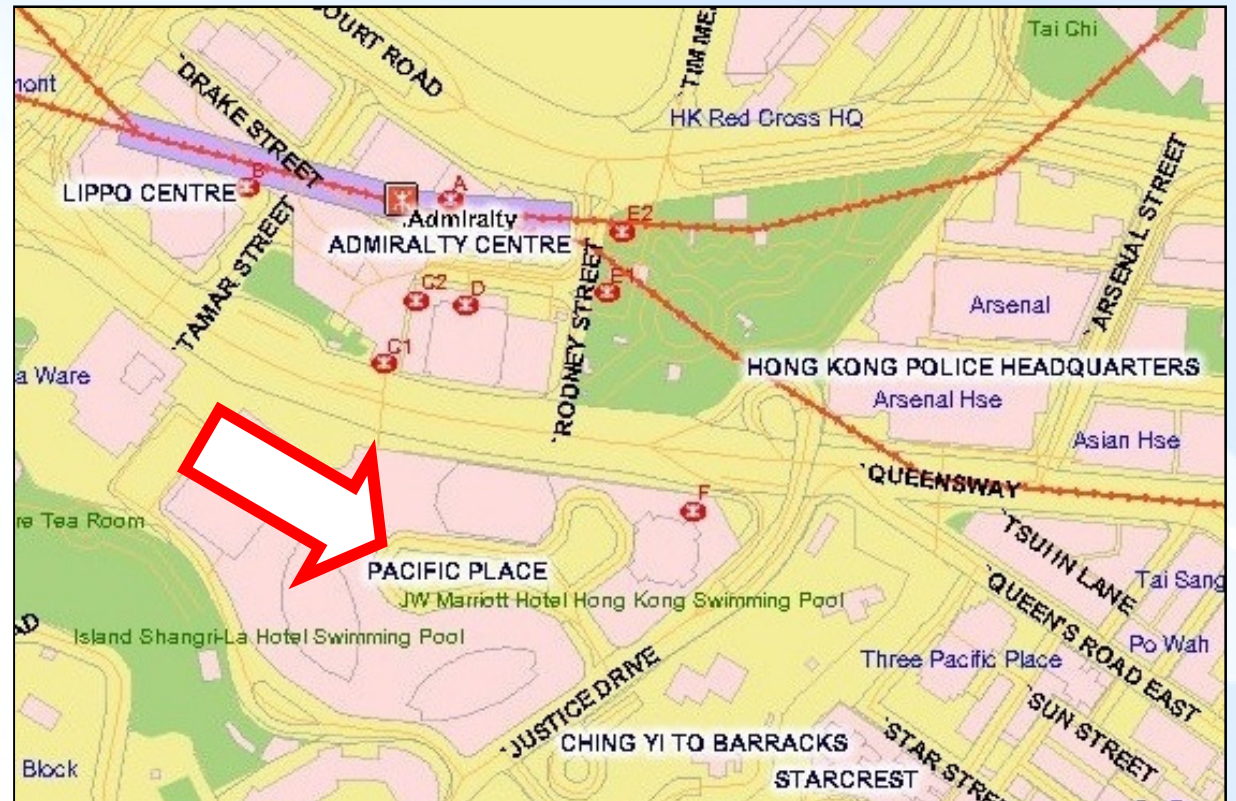
## **Getting to One Pacific Place**
